

Requirements to supply certified palm oil

- RSPO membership
- Company must have its own certification if it takes legal ownership in the supply chain
- Company's supplier's certificate not adequate on its own
- Supply Chain Certification only available through RSPO approved 3rd party certification bodies
- Initial assessment / annual surveillance audits

Certification requirements

- Documented management systems procedures covering:
 - Control method Identity Preserved / Segregation / Mass Balance
 - Verification of Supplier certified status
 - Purchasing
 - Material receipt and storage
 - Processing / manufacturing
 - Sales and Distribution
 - Records
 - Multi-site
 - Certification scope as agreed

Multi-site certification

- Available for companies with 2 or more operating sites
- Allows a sampling approach for auditing
- Requirement for internal audit
- Scope includes Central Office and sites making RSPO claims
- Scope of certification can be extended at any time.

Supply chain models

- Identify preserved physically traceable back to a specific certified plantation
- Segregation physically traceable to 2 or more certified plantations
- Mass Balance an administrative approach to controlling and monitoring the mixing of RSPO and conventional palm oil
- Book & Claim Greenpalm

Certification process

- Same process as FSC
 - Request for quote
 - Contractual agreement (scope duration and costs)
 - Conflict of interest
 - Auditor competency
- Annual re-assessment > 500 tonnes
- 3-year assessment < 500 tonnes
- Standards available free to download on RSPO website (www.rspo.org)

The certification experience


- Existing management systems will already cover most of what is required
- Specific RSPO elements
- Management approach defined within RSPO scheme documentation
- Identification of critical control points (CCPs) covering traceability and control of claims
- Verifiable RSPO claims through:
 - Top line management documentation specifying supply chain mechanism and controls
 - Certification Scope
 - Intake checks
 - Responsibilities
 - Training
 - Contingency plans

RSPO specific elements


- Supplier verification
 - RSPO member
 - Supply chain certified (copy of certificate and check RSPO database)
 - Supplier scope
 - Identification of all palm inputs (non-certified suppliers)
 - Hidden palm
- Material Receipt
 - check for RSPO claims on supplier documentation
- For IP / SG physical segregation of certified products
- References to IP / SG / MB for product specifications and traceability
- Reconciliation of inputs and outputs
- Appropriate Use of RSPO trademarks and labels


Identity Preserved (IP)
